Great Barrington, MA — On the Berkshire Opera Festival mainstage this year is a new production of **Charles Gounod's** *FAUST*, the story of tragedy and redemption that stands at the summit of French romantic opera. Surging with memorable and timeless music, it has remained one of the world's most popular operas ever since its premiere and is considered Gounod's masterpiece. Based on Goethe's play, the story introduces the original "Faustian bargain"—old Dr. Faust sells his soul to the devil to be young again—but his decision has devastating consequences.

Conductor and Berkshire Opera Festival Co-Founder **Brian Garman** says, "BOF enters the realm of French grand opera for the first time with these performances of *Faust*. We're thrilled to be able to do it with the remarkable talents of this internationally-acclaimed cast as we begin our residency at the Mahaiwe Performing Arts Center."

Of BOF's new production, Stage Director and BOF Co-Founder **Jonathon Loy** says: "I'm very excited to produce *Faust* this summer. Gounod's romantic music is exquisite, and everyone will be familiar with the tale of the old man, Dr. Faust, who sells his soul to the devil, for a chance to be young and fall in love, just one more time. You won't be surprised that this deal does not work out so well for the mortal parties involved."

Three performances of *Faust* take place at **Mahaiwe Performing Arts Center** in **Great Barrington**, which will be BOF's home for the next several seasons. The organizations have a shared aspiration to bring world-class performing arts to the Berkshires and to formalize that connection through this multi-year commitment.

All artists in the esteemed *Faust* cast are making their BOF debut. In the title role is tenor **Duke Kim**, 2021 winner of the Metropolitan Opera Laffont Competition. Kim also performed with Seattle Opera (*Il Barbiere di Siviglia*) and

Pittsburgh Opera (La Traviata) this year, following Glimmerglass last summer (Roméo et Juliette). In the role of Marguerite is **Raquel González**, whom Opera News called a "true artist," and is a returning member of the Metropolitan Opera's roster. She also sang with Houston Grand Opera (Madama Butterfly) this season, and previously Lyric Opera of Chicago and Opera Theatre of Saint Louis. Méphistophélès will be played by Justin **Hopkins**, whose bass-baritone was described by the *Los Angeles Times* as "beautifully focused." His recent engagements include La Monnaie, Grand Théâtre de Genève, Bard Music Festival, and Austin Lyric Opera. **Jarrett Porter**, described by *Opera News* as "a supple, vibrant lyric baritone" and who will perform in five operas at Oper Frankfurt this year, will play Valentin. In the role of Siébel is **Sun-Ly Pierce**, who recently wowed audiences and critics in Rodelinda at Hudson Hall. Pierce has been praised by Opera News for her "lush, flexible mezzo-soprano," and this season she also starred in productions at Houston Grand Opera (Suzuki in Madama Butterfly), Des Moines Metro Opera (Il Barbiere di Siviglia), and made her Metropolitan Opera debut in La Rondine. In the role of Marthe Schwerlein is mezzo-soprano **Abbegael Greene**, who received a Master's degree in voice performance from Bard College Conservatory. Kyle Dunn, 2024 Apprentice Artist at Sarasota Opera and a graduate of Peabody Institute, sings Wagner.

BOF is pleased to announce the naming of its artistic directorship for **William E. Briggs**, in honor of his longstanding and transformative support of Berkshire Opera Festival. Briggs, along with partner Donald Usher, has provided both financial and in-kind backing through the years that has been immensely beneficial to the company's operations. Brian Garman, BOF's William E. Briggs Artistic Director and Co-Founder, remarked, "We're so very pleased to name this position for Bill Briggs, whose support has been absolutely critical to BOF's success over the past decade. I am deeply humbled by his generosity, and delighted to count him and Don as friends." In response to this naming, Mr. Briggs commented, "I was intrigued by the idea of bringing opera back to the Berkshires, and very eager to support the vision of these two young entrepreneurs [Garman and co-founder Jonathon Loy]. As BOF continues to expand its programming to include more productions, educational initiatives, and community outreach, my hope is that many others will join me in financially supporting this exceptional organization."

Berkshire Opera Festival looks forward to its **10th anniversary season in 2025**, when the mainstage production will be Verdi's magnificent *La Traviata*, starring **Vanessa Becerra**, **Joshua Blue**, and **Darren Drone**. Performances will take place **August 23**, **26**, and **29** at the **Mahaiwe Performing Arts Center**.

Berkshire Opera Festival (BOF) is a fully-producing summer festival founded by Jonathon Loy and Brian Garman which presented its first season in 2016. The mission of Berkshire Opera Festival is to entertain and enrich the lives of people of all ages and backgrounds throughout the Berkshire region by providing accessible and affordable performances of a broad range of operas with the highest artistic standards. Each summer, BOF presents musically and dramatically compelling operatic productions, in addition to recitals and other related musical events. Recent productions include Puccini's *La Bohème*, Mozart's *Don Giovanni*, Jake Heggie's *Three Decembers*, Verdi's *Falstaff*, Tom Cipullo's *Glory Denied*, Puccini's *Madama Butterfly*, Strauss's *Ariadne auf Naxos*, Verdi's *Rigoletto*, Donizetti's *Don Pasquale*, and a NYC workshop performance of Anthony Davis's new opera *The Reef*.

Garman and Loy have been friends for over 20 years since their early career days at Pittsburgh Opera, with combined experience at the Metropolitan Opera, Santa Fe Opera, Seattle Opera, and New York City Opera. Loy has deep family ties in the Berkshires, and the Iowa-born Garman credits Loy for convincing him to take root in the bucolic Berkshires, finding the area revelatory in its beauty and depth of culture.
